Woman to Woman

"Hear my cry, O God; attend to my prayer. From the end of the earth I will cry to You, when my heart is overwhelmed; lead me to the rock that is higher than I" (Psalm 61:1-2). This has been my cry for some time now. I have found myself in a place, like David, where peace was elusive, hope was slim, and the light at the end of the way was quite dim indeed. I have also found rest in the arms of my Savior. I have found a quiet, when all around was clamor. But I know too well, that unless I am deliberate about seeking Him, I can get lost in pain, in worry, in fear. What about you, dear sister? Have you reached the end of your endurance even as we begin a brand new year? As I read the story of Jephthah, a Judge in Israel, God allowed some parallels to settle in my heart- great victories, redemption, great joy...and great pain.

Jephthah had made a vow to God. In return for victory over the people of Ammon, Jephthah promised to offer to God, as an offering, the first thing that greeted him on his return home. He was victorious. He was greeted by his daughter, his only child. His heart was overwhelmed. As much as he might not have wanted to keep his word, he did. He gave back to God what wasn't his anyway. His daughter went to serve God as a virgin, which meant, for Jephthah, an end to his family line- something that was very serious and tragic for an Israelite. Later, in Hebrews 11:32-34, he was commended for running the race with endurance. It is said that out of his weakness, he was made strong. May that be said of you and me.

I wrote in my journal not long ago of all the things that I tried not to think about. Things connected to an abusive childhood, the death of my first husband, and especially the death of my son right before my eyes. I am not a stranger to pain; yet neither am I stranger to joy and laughter. I have been hope-less, but I have known great hope. I have felt a soul-deep tiredness, but I have also danced with abandon (quite gracelessly, I might add). I have felt the cold, lonely ache of grief, but I have also known the sweetness of God's comfort. I am making it through the dark nights, slowly, painstakingly, but the dawn beckons. I am weak....ah, but I'll be made strong, for His strength is made perfect in my weakness.

I will gaze on a bright new day, and with the crystalline sparkle of tears in my eyes, I will dance. Undignified though I may be, I will dance before my Lord.
